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MASS OF DELIVERANCE

FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR MICHELLE LEONARD OAM: The LEC legacy of musical generosity, excellence and contribution to the cultural landscape is truly exemplified by the ongoing commissioning and performance of this larger scale choral work. This remarkable choir of non-auditioned singers rehearsing in a school hall in Sydney's inner west has much to be proud of. What you will hear today has been a long time in the making – but great things come to those who wait! Eight years ago I met Dan with my fourth (and final) newborn at the front door of my new home – I had barely unpacked the boxes! By the time we had a coffee with my now infamous scrambled eggs, we had both decided that the LEC needed to perform a larger scale work written by him - it turned out to be one of the best musical investments I had ever made!

Since the premiere of this work in 2014, *Mass of Deliverance* has been nominated for Choral Work on the Year in 2015 by APRA AMCOS, performed by Song Company under Roland Peelman and performed by the Choir of St James for a special Australia Day Mass in 2016. Also in 2016, Sydney Philharmonia recorded it for their CD. In 2020 the LEC members rallied to support the performing arts sector during COVID, and one palpable way was through the commissioning of three new auxiliary movements for this Mass. The addition of these allows a wider emotional arc to exist, as well as to showcase two soloists and Dan's unique ability to distil the emotional intensity of the Latin text within a contemporary choral framework. The incredible cohesive combination of brass, percussion and piano gives so much scope for intimacy and grandeur – from the hauntingly beautiful flugal solo to the syncopated punctuations between the instrumentalists and singers as both seek to grab the audience's attention in a true battle of the musical wills. Each movement encapsulates the essence of the text – all culminating in the final work filled with hope and light – Lux Aeterna. We dedicate this performance to the remarkable musicianship of the late Paul Goodchild, who supported its creation every step of the way.

FROM THE COMPOSER DAN WALKER: The original iteration of my *Mass of Deliverance* comprises the six movements that we associate with the basic Latin Mass setting. It features the Kyrie, Gloria, Credo, Sanctus, Benedictus and Agnus Dei texts that have been used for hundreds of years, by composers from Machaut to Mozart, Josquin to Frank Martin. Occasionally we hear additional texts that denote a particular type of service: The Requiem, for example, will often open with a Requiem Aeternam introduction, as well as feature movements such as the Dies Irae and Hostias texts. These texts, with themes of judgement and reckoning, indicate that this particular mass is one that celebrates, or mourns, the dead.

When Michelle asked me to write several additional movements, it was during a very difficult time for musicians everywhere. No one was more maligned than singers; with their crisp plosives showering audiences and fellow singers alike with virus-laden aerosols. Knowing that the performance of this final work could well be several years away, I decided that I would turn the work into something of a Mass for renewal, with additional texts hinting at the idea of rebirth, salvation, and solidarity. While the texts are liturgical in nature, the themes they represent transcend music purely designed for worship: they remind us of a time when things will be better; when we will be reunited with loved ones; and a time that for many, may signal the end of imposed isolation and solitude. The Tuba Finem, or Final Trumpet movement I have posthumously dedicated to the late Paul Goodchild, who was instrumental in the genesis of the original mass and played for its premiere. The work now features Mezzo soprano and Baritone soloists, who sing very much in conjunction with the choir, along with the ensemble of piano, percussion and brass quintet.

I'd like to thank Michelle and the wonderful members of the Leichhardt Espresso Chorus for once again bringing this work to life, at a time when embracing and supporting our music-makers is more important than ever.



Michelle Leonard OAM: Michelle is the founding Artistic Director and Conductor of Leichhardt Espresso Chorus and its chamber choir, Ristretto. She is widely sought after as a choral clinician on Australian repertoire and appears regularly as a guest speaker, adjudicator and workshop facilitator. Michelle was awarded the Order of Australia Medal for Services to the Community and Performing Arts in 2017. Michelle is also the founder, Artistic Director and Conductor of Moorambilla Voices. This nationally awarded program seeks at its core to give country kids a rare opportunity to sing, dance and create incredible performances with artists of the highest calibre. Dan Walker: Canberra composer, conductor and performer Dan Walker is one of Australia's most in-demand choral specialists. He has written music for the Sydney Symphony Orchestra, Queensland Symphony Orchestra, Australian Chamber Orchestra, Gondwana Choirs and Halcyon. As a performer, Dan is a member of the Clarion vocal quartet, Sydney-based Cantillation, and Pinchgut Opera. He is a guest performer with The Song Company and was a founding member of early music ensemble 'The Parson's Affayre'. A keenly sought-after conductor, Dan has appeared as chorus-master for the Sydney and Melbourne Symphony Choruses, and is now music director of the Canberra Choral Society, Oriana Chamber Choir, Luminescence Chamber Singers and the Canberra Community Chorale.
